








## **Dictation/Running Dictation**



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
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


Stress Pattern: 2-syllable words, stress on 1st syllable.










Stress Pattern: 2-syllable words, stress on 1st syllable.




Stress Pattern: 3-syllable words, stress on 1st syllable.

#### Instructions

### Option 1
